

Velvetbean is a traditional southern crop used to fatten cattle. It is no longer widely used, but can be used as a summer cover crop. It is reported to suppress nematodes. It may attract velvetbean caterpillar and termination may be difficult.

Velvetbean can be terminated by mowing, herbicides or tillage. Mowing or undercutting is preferred method, but many velvetbeans are very viney and can present problems for mowers.	NC State Summer Cover Crop Information Sheet
